Table on the Implementation of Commitments

Summary of Conclusions

From the First and the Second Inter-Party Dialogue in the National Assembly of the Republic of Serbia On Improving the Conditions for Holding Parliamentary Elections Belgrade,

14 -15 November 2019

The table below provides an overview on the level of achievements of the commitments taken during the first Inter-Party Dialogue held 10 and 11 October 2019 and new proposals from the Second Inter-Party Dialogue held on 15 November 2019 in the National Assembly of the Republic of Serbia.

Principles:

Independent regulatory bodies should be empowered to exercise their monitoring and oversight role proactively and effectively;

A level playing field among contestants should be guaranteed and the separation between party and state activities needs to be strictly adhered to;

Unbalanced media coverage should be tackled;

All reforms should be prepared and implemented in an inclusive and transparent manner.
